

We had a quiet first quarter which was highlighted by our presentation at the February club Annual General Meeting. It was good to report that we are now generating over \$1 million of revenue each year and that our financial position remains secure and well managed.

A very wet winter has affected our recruitment efforts - it's hard to ask folks for initiation fees to play tennis when thanks to Mother Nature the courts are unplayable; however when Spring does actually spring out we anticipate a good number of new members joining the club whose initiation and Club Improvement Fees will add to the club reserves and help us meet planned House & Grounds expenditures. We are also looking forward to continued revenue growth from our Tennis Department, the exciting Rafael Nadal clinics, and the summer camp projects.

It can be said that talking about the club's financing is boring, but that's the way the FC wants it to be. A strong financial position with all the checks and balances in place is what we have and this is the way forward.

As those of you who attended the AGM will know, my friend and longtime club and committee member Frank Battatt was awarded the Marty Marks Volunteer of the Year award. Hopefully by now we are all aware of Frank's contribution to MTC over the decades since he was a founding member. However, as we all have a life outside of MTC we thought it would be good to have an "up close and personal" report from Frank about his career. We asked him for his comments and we are sharing them here:

"I have spent my life in business with my two brothers. We began by taking over our father's export business, exporting foods to many countries. We started a farming subsidiary in 1968 growing turkeys, and eventually switched from turkeys to chickens growing for Foster Farms. We farmed almonds, and harvested and packed and sold them to institutional users in the U.S. and overseas. We built a winery in Yountville in 1980 and exited the business in 1995. We exited the farming business in 2014. We started an import division in 1995 and supplied private label canned and packaged fruits and vegetables to large retailers. We exited that business in 2014. Currently our firm still exports foods to overseas markets.

I have a degree in physics from UC Berkeley and since 1968 have been writing the software on which our business runs. I have a life long experience in managing business operations and accounting and have written accounting software for all our operations. In 1972 I joined the initial group of founders of Marin Tennis Club and enjoyed the new facilities when we started in September 1973. From 1982 through 1995 I was mostly traveling for our winery business but once home again, I became active again at MTC. I was on the Finance Committee from 1995 to 2000, going onto the Board in 1998. I was President in 2001. Along with Liz Tabussi we started the social tennis committee I think in 2005 or 2006 and I left that in 2015 to go back on the Finance Committee."

I personally look forward to hearing more details on Frank's international experiences. Needless to say the FC looks forward to Frank's tireless contribution to ensure the club's continued prosperity.

Everything but the Back Courts Shade Solution are funded, and construction will begin after the Memorial Day Tournament. The idea of the shade for the back courts is approved...but we still need to design it and price it. The Solar Take-Over will allow us to move from paying service fees, to reaping the benefits of a reduced electrical bill.

FY 23 Project Priorities: Access Entry Gate




This gate will help keep the club secure and allow members easy access by scanning a bar code on the MTC app. Guests can ring a bell and use an intercom to request entry. This gate will be along the main entry path, approximately at the baseline of court 9.




Inspired by our beloved patio, the current chain link and fading 1970's era sign will transform into a vine-covered shaded trellis with updated branding. Juniors will have a shady place to sit while waiting to be picked up.





In about a month from now this project will have satisfied the Health Department's request to upgrade our pool entry gates to the current code. We've been clearing all the storage behind the eastern side pool fence. This project will demo that fence, significantly expanding the usable area around the pool. This change will allow us to experiment with other uses and imagine desirable future uses in this underutilized piece of our club property.

FY 23 Project Priorities: Pool Gates & Fences




