- The Calcutta tournament was a huge success and led to great community building among our members who participated.


- Brand-new controlled-entry front entry gate for greater security is now operational.



You have a book, leave it on the shelves. You want a book, browse and take what you want; return when you can. All subjects, hard-cover, soft-cover, in good condition.














Expanding our MTC Communications Team

MTC Finance Committee Update

As we move into the fall, it's time for the Flnance Committee to start the annual budget process. The goal is to have the club operating budget for 2024 in place and signed off by the FC and the Board by year end.

The approved budget provides a yardstick as we go through 2024. Every month the FC receives and reviews the prior month's financials, which includes a comparison to budgeted numbers for the month. Variances, favorable and unfavorable, are noted by the GM and become part of the FC monthly meetings, where recommendations on how we might move back to budget are discussed.

The MTC operational budget is relatively consistent, with the main drivers for revenue being a good estimate of likely membership and, following recommendation from the FC and approval from the Board, the proposed monthly membership dues for 2024.

The GM and Controller prepare an operations cost budget driven primarily by anticipated number of employees and related costs, plus any anticipated cost increases and potential savings for utilities and maintenance.

Non-operational revenues and expenditures, primarily new member installation fees and payment of refundable memberships plus an annual depreciation charge, are shown as "below the line" items. In the past few years (post COVID) new membership fees have been significant.

With the new Tennis Program started in 2023 and exciting tournaments and summer programs, the GM and our Tennis Director will complete a separate budget, which once approved by the Board will roll up into the 2024 Club Budget.

A similar exercise will be completed for our revamped and now in-house food and beverage program (MTC Cafe).

As I said in our last newsletter, financial matters can be boring, but planned well can make for a very strong and solvent association of friends and colleagues.

MTC Tennis Committee Update

Dear MTC Tennis Community - The Tennis Committee has had a very productive summer. In addition to our usual team formation and captain selection tasks, we worked on the court reservation system. This entailed a member survey which essentially said the online reservation system works fairly well, a few drop-in courts are ok, not much interest in challenge courts. The one comment we heard over and over was that you could not find a court online but there were many courts available if you showed up.

TC agrees and has long felt the court reservation system needs updating and consequences for "no shows." To this end, the committee drafted a proposal for the board which states there shall be no show fees which escalate with number of occurrences. The board approved this and was implemented as of October 1.

As for team formation – Yup, it's time again. Chris sent the Call for Captains for 40+, 18+ Mixed and 65 teams - please step up to captain. We've had some new captains this year and it's been great! Registration opens November 5, closes a month later and play begins in January 2024!

We have also had some changes to the Tennis Committee members. First, Molie Malone is now the co-chair with me. I've really enjoyed working with her and having a partner - TC is a pretty big job!

In other news, Amy See was kind enough to rejoin us; Jerod Mah continues as our 5.0 rep, Chris Trepte-4.5, Mike Lustenberger, Dave Hirschkop, Francie Burkhard and Kris Hinckley all 4.0, Elliott Magnuson, Andy Fremier, Marlies Zeisler, 3.5, Em Lieginger 3.0 - We could use a men's 3.0 rep! And last but not least, John Michelson - our non-USTA representative.

USTA FAQ - We see this one every season. The opposing captain says they cannot field a lineup and thus will forfeit the entire match. This is not allowed by the USTA and will result in a loss for BOTH teams and possible sanctions. At least two lines must be played to constitute a legal match. So, if you're a captain and you are presented with this scenario - it's inconvenient and unfair but you will have to work with the other captain to get at least two lines played on another date.

Finally, please feel free to reach out to any of us on the Tennis Committee with your thoughts and concerns - we are your representatives and appreciate your input.



Laurence lives in Corte Madera with his wife and two young boys.


Professional life: I was educated and trained as a professional architect. However, I have always been an entrepreneur at my

I write this September 2023 MTC News House & Grounds Committee article as a summary of the projects MTC has started, completed, and plans to complete in the next month. Gervais Tompkin and I agreed to co-chair the MTC House & Grounds Committee in 2021. In 2021 MTC told the HGC that MTC priority projects were a manned Entrance Control Kiosk at the parking lot club entrance and a remodel of the pool locker rooms to accommodate a Fitness Center and equipment. The HGC met monthly to develop the priority MTC projects and in March 2022 HGC decided to retain the professional services of Studio Green Landscape Architects to develop a Facilities Master Plan for 2023 – 2025 MTC Capital Improvement Projects. HGC was completing the +\$200,000 plexi-pave and resurface construction of Courts 10, 11 & 12 in 2022.

The Studio Green planning effort was completed in October 2022 and the Architect Plans included the following projects:

- 1. Concrete sidewalk hazard removal and replacement
- 2. Patio Court 8 handrail
- 3. Automated Controlled Entry Gate (the Entry Kiosk idea was replaced with an electronic MTC members entry gate)
- 4. New Pool Gates (2) mandated by Marin County Health Department regulations
- 5. Pool Area Improvements remove fences (2), storage sheds, & improve site landscape
- 6. New Service Entry Gate required because the Controlled Entry Gate reduces main entrance sidewalk width for MTC materials, equipment and deliveries
- 7. Improve Club Entrance Trellis, Planters, Lighting, and Signage
- 8. Remodel the Pool Building
- 9. Club Fitness Pavilion near the pool and Courts 11 & 12
- 10. Lazy Acres Improvements shade structure,
- 11. BBQ, tables, seating, and social area(s)
- 12. Accessible Pathway from Service Gate to locker rooms and clubhouse/food service doors
- 13. Courts 2, 3, 5, & 6 patio Shade Structure



In late 2022, HGC, the MTC Finance Committee and the MTC Board decided to proceed with 1. Concrete sidewalk hazard removal and replacement, 2. Patio – Court 8 handrail, 3. Automated Controlled Entry Gate, 4. New Pool Gates (2), 5. Pool Site Improvements, 6. New Service Entry Gate, 7. Club Entrance Trellis, Planters, Lighting, and Signage

Chris Horne agreed that I, Reinhard Ludke, S.E., would be the Construction Manager for the 2023 MTC projects. I identified and selected pre-qualified subcontractors to perform the work. Gervais and I supplemented the Studio Green drawings as needed for design

and detail and provided the contractors with project construction Plans, Specifications, and Scope of Work. I met with the Contractors and negotiated the Scope, Schedule and Costs Agreements. Chris Horne has signed all Agreements and Change Orders

for MTC based on my recommendation and authorization. MTC acts as the Owner/Construction Manager and hires and manages the sub-contractors scope of work and construction schedule.2023 MTC Capital Projects – managed construction sub-contractors

June 2023 New Service Entry Gate fabricated and installed MTC members have used the new Service Entrance since July 10 when MTC commenced construction of the Control Entry Gate and the Entrance Trellis, Planters and Signage construction



Construction Schedule Progress Report

The HGC decided to have the Control Entry Gate and the

Entrance Trellis projects constructed at the same time since each construction project requires the closure of the main entrance and detour staff and members to enter at the Service Gate. The "start" of the construction on July 10 was because fabrication of the steel Entry Gate had to be complete and ready for



installation before MTC authorized RWR
Construction to commence demolition and
excavation for Gate and Trellis concrete
foundation grade beams. The new Controlled
Entry Gate required installing an electrical
conduit for wires and cables underground and in
a trench under the concrete slab from Court 10
to Court 1, attached to the concrete wall at Court
1, and trench under the concrete slab from Court
1 to the clubhouse and then into the office utility
room. Following is the Progress Report on the

Gate and Trellis construction.

Monday, July 10 – construction commenced – demolition and excavation

July 11 – July 14 - grade beam construction, reinforcing, anchor bolts, post bases

Friday, July 14 – electrical conduit installation

Monday, July 17 – grade beams concrete placed

Friday, July 21 – electric wires installed in conduits from Gate to MTC office utility room

Monday, July 24 - Gate Frame installed

Tuesday, July 25 – Trellis timber posts



July 26 – August 4 Trellis timber framing

Monday, August 7 – Trellis planter's construction

Monday, August 14 – Control Entry Gate installed

Thursday, August 17 – Place slab on grade and planter box concrete



Monday, August 21 – Complete trellis timber and bracing construction

Tuesday, August 22 – Remove planter's formwork and clean-up

Thursday, August 24 – Gate wires connected to Gate equipment and control equipment at the office.
